Signs of PAH Distress: You can add signs your child may have here...

- Purple or blue discoloration of lips, skin, and fingernails
- Racing heart and flushed cheeks
- Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath.
- Extreme paleness
- Tiredness or Headache
- Fainting or Seizure
- Low Oxygen saturations and a high heart rate

## Signs Remodulin pump may be malfunctioning or tubing is disconnected:

- Wetness or crusting around Pump Site
- Loose tubing from Pump
- Alarm or Beeping noise coming from pump
- Any of the above signs of PAH Distress would also be an indication of pump malfunction.
