# **Behavioral and Developmental Sciences Scope of Services**

March 2022

## **Psychology Service**

The psychologists at Texas Children's provide neuropsychological assessment, diagnostic assessment, and short-term, evidence-based interventions for patients with co-occurring medical conditions and those requiring specialty care for specific anxiety or disruptive behavior disorders.

#### Assessments

- Difficulty adjusting to medical diagnosis, coping, procedural difficulty, suboptimal adherence to medical
- OCD and a subset of Anxiety Disorders (Social Phobia, Separation Anxiety, Selective Mutism, Health Anxiety, Specific Phobia, Panic Disorder)
- ADHD (< 6 years old)</li>
- Preschool behavioral problems (≤ 6 years old)
- Trauma related to unintentional or accidental injury
- Neuropsychological evaluations-Assesses normal and abnormal central nervous system function associated with brain injury or disease (Brain tumors, Seizures, Diabetes, Traumatic brain injuries, etc.)
- Psychoeducational evaluations (self pay)

## <u>Interventions</u>

All patients receive an initial assessment for diagnostic purposes and to determine fit for intervention programs.

- Therapy
  - Pediatric Health Psychology Program
    - Inpatient and outpatient
    - Patients treated for chronic/life threatening illness within our medical system
  - OCD and Anxiety Disorders Program (OC/ADP)
    - Evidence based treatment (typically CBT) with family component)
  - Brief Behavioral Intervention (BBI)
    - Evidence based treatment program for preschool disruptive behavior and/or ADHD (typically focused on caregiver-child dyads)
  - Inpatients with Autism and behavior getting in the
  - -Limited services available at Primary Care locations

# **Psychiatry Service**

Psychiatry services at TCH provides families with a comprehensive assessment and ongoing evidenced based care for youth with mental health disorders ncluding Major Depression, Anxiety Disorders, Bipola and related Mood Disorders, Psychosis, treatment resistant ADHD, Autism and complex behavioral

## **Assessments**

- Age range= 5-16
- Complicated ADHD (failed two trials of care)
- Anxiety disorders • Bipolar disorders
- Depressive disorders • Disruptive behavior disorders (e.g.- ODD)
- Patients with chronic suicidal or self-injurious behaviors
- Psychotic disorders
- Health conditions with co-morbid psychiatric disorders

#### <u>Interventions</u>

- Ongoing psychiatric management when indicated
- Community service coordination
- Family education and advocacy
- Transition support

# **Developmental Pediatrics** and Autism

Developmental Pediatrics and Autism provides diagnostic and treatment planning consultations for children spanning the full spectrum of neurodevelopmental-behavioral pediatrics from intellectual disabilities, autism spectrum disorder, and cerebral palsy, to learning disorders, ADHD, and motor incoordination and their associated behavioral problems including consultations for those at risk due to prematurity and other neonatal complications, congenital heart disease, birth defects, or genetic syndromes.

#### <u>Assessments</u>

- Age range= 0 -12 years for general Developmental Pediatrics and Autism
- Age range= 0-18 for specialty clinics Down Syndrome, Spina Bifida, CDOP, Fragile X
- Developmental delays/problems
  - Including speech/language/social communication, gross/fine motor, and cognitive/adaptive delays
- Autism spectrum disorder
- School-aged children with learning and/or attention
- High risk for developmental delays/learning problems

  - Congenital anomalies/genetic syndromes (congenital heart disease, spina bifida, cerebral palsy, Down syndrome, Fragile X syndrome)

#### <u>Interventions</u>

#### For patients evaluated through the Meyer Center for **Developmental Pediatrics and Autism:**

- Provision of community resource information
- Family education and supportive services
- Parent Management Training (<6 years old with autism)
- Parent Management Training for children with developmental disabilities
- \*\*Educational programming is open to all families, including those from the community and followed in other services. See clinic newsletter for program details.

### **Exclusion Criterion for all service lines:**

- Acutely psychotic, manic, or suicidal/self-injurious patients needing inpatient level of care
- Aggressive behaviors related to Autism or intellectual disability
- Behavioral therapy/support for intellectual disability
- Conduct disorder
- primary care, medication management, and/or ongoing developmental monitoring
- Established developmental or behavioral diagnosis seeking
- Family/divorce adjustments
- Established developmental or behavioral diagnosis seeking Forensic evaluations (court ordered, parental custody
  - Psychiatric emergencies (including acute suicidal/homicidal ideation)
- intervention services such as behavioral therapy, ABA, etc. Substance-Related Disorders Therapy for maltreatment
