\$82.4 MILLION FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE



- The unreimbursed cost of providing care for children and pregnant women who qualify for Medicaid and CHIP
- \$13 million in charity care for medically and financially indigent patients
- Hematology/Oncology comprised a quarter of services provided

\$28.6 MILLION PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION



- 174 residents enrolled in pediatric residency program
- 15 residents participated in the Global Health Program
- 3,000 professionals trained on child abuse and neglect
- 140+ clinical fellows trained in 25 subspecialties

\$55.6 MILLION RESEARCH



- 800 ongoing clinical trials
- 800,000+ square feet of lab space
- 295 investigators
- 1,800+ research projects

\$3.2 MILLION CASH & IN-KIND CONTRIBUTIONS

\$3.5 MILLION COMMUNITY HEALTH



- Social workers helped 560 patients acquire health coverage at five Community Cares practices
- 1,000+ portable cribs provided for safe sleep
- More than 4,200 car seats inspected and installed correctly
- 1,200+ new car seats provided
- 9,600 hours of education administered

\$4.8 MILLION SUBSIDIZED HEALTH CARE*



- More than 7,500 children treated at mobile clinics
- Almost 4,000 children with special health care needs received dental care

*Services underwritten by the hospital due to the unavailability of specialized care in the community setting, thereby impeding access to lifesaving care

ACCESS

- Houston is the 4th largest city in the nation
- 25% of children live in poverty
- Almost 800,000 children in Harris County eligible for health coverage, but are not enrolled



PREVENTION

- 638 children in Texas died in motor vehicle crashes, almost 130,000 injured
- 66,000+ victims of child abuse and neglect in Texas, 9,000+ from the Houston region
