APPLICATION PROCESS

To apply for the residency, the following must be completed and entered into PhORCAS prior to the on-site interview:

- Letter of Intent
- Curriculum vitae
- Three letters of recommendation
- Transcript of course work from Pharmacy School
- Completion of application requirements to the University of Houston College of Pharmacy

The application for the residency program is due **January 5, 2026**.

Program interview requirements:

PPS or pre-application interview must be completed prior to extending an on-site interview offer.

The residency begins approximately July 1.
