

Pediatric Transplant Nutrition Practicum



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Overview:

Texas Children's Hospital is the nation's largest, not-for-profit pediatric hospital. This state-of-the-art facility provides primary, secondary and tertiary care for a diverse population of chronically and acutely ill children. Texas Children's Hospital collaborates with the Baylor College of Medicine to support a comprehensive pediatric medical education and research program. The Texas Children's Transplant program is the largest in the country and has done approximately 2000 solid organ transplants to date.

Program Description:

The Pediatric Transplant Nutrition Practicum at Texas Children's Hospital reviews the basics in pediatric nutrition and transplant. Topics including pediatric transplant evaluation, nutritional assessment, nutrition education and complex cases involving enteral and parenteral nutrition for various transplant patients are emphasized. Discussion among physicians and dietitians is primarily informal. The course pivots around practical experience and serves as time to receive a broad overview of pediatric transplant nutrition with the largest pediatric transplant program.

The specific goals and objectives of the program are:

- 1. To become familiar with pediatric transplant nutrition
- 2. To receive a unique training experience on transplant nutrition at the largest pediatric transplant program
- 3. To recognize the importance of working within a transplant interdisciplinary team
- 4. To feel confident in caring for complex pediatric transplant patients nutritionally

Practicum Schedule:

The practicum is a one week in person program (with a four hour virtual training the week prior). The typical schedule is Monday to Friday, eight hour days with a break for lunch. Estimated CEUs provided for the program are 20 (pending per CDR).

Entrance Requirements:

Applicants must:

- A. Be a current Registered Dietitian
- B. Be working in or interested in pediatric transplant

A complete application must include the following:

- A. Pediatric Transplant Nutrition Practicum Application
- B. Professional Resume (CV)
- C. Reference Letter (to be included in packet or directly sent in)

Winter Program: December 6th, 2024 (for February 16-20, 2026)

Fall Program: July 3rd, 2026 (for September 14-18, 2026)
